Few words about Vitoria-Gasteiz

Vitoria-Gasteiz is the capital of the Basque Country (Euskadi) and one of its most liveable cities. Located in the heart of Euskadi, the city has around 260,000 inhabitants and plays an important role in regional and European administrative life. Vitoria-Gasteiz is widely recognised for its commitment to sustainability and environmental quality and was awarded the title of European Green Capital in 2012.

The city combines a well-preserved historic centre with forward-looking urban planning. Its Medieval Quarter is one of the best preserved in the region, while the surrounding neighbourhoods are characterised by green spaces, pedestrian areas, and easy internal mobility. The Green Belt that surrounds the city is one of its most distinctive features and a key element of everyday life.

Did you know:

- Vitoria-Gasteiz was named Capital of Gastronomy in 2014.
- Its Historic Centre was declared a Monumental Ensemble in 1997.
- The Cathedral of Santa María is part of the UNESCO-recognised Northern Routes of the Way of Saint James.



LCAMP Conference Venue (22 April)

The **LCAMP Conference and Student Hub 2026** will take place at the Europa Conference Centre (Palacio de Congresos Europa) in Vitoria-Gasteiz. This modern and functional venue is designed to host international conferences and large-scale events, offering high-quality facilities and services in a central and easily accessible location.

How to get to Vitoria-Gasteiz

Vitoria-Gasteiz is well connected by air, rail, and road, making it easily accessible from different parts of Europe.

By plane

- Vitoria-Gasteiz Airport is located a short distance from the city centre and offers limited connections. Alternatively, [Bilbao Airport \(BIO\)](#), with a wide range of international flights, is **approximately one hour away by car or bus**.

By train

- Vitoria-Gasteiz is well connected by rail, with direct services to major cities and regional hubs. The train station is located close to the city centre, with easy access to local transport.

By bus

- The central bus station offers frequent national and regional connections. It is located near the city centre and provides good links to surrounding areas.

By car

- Vitoria-Gasteiz is accessible via major road networks and motorways, making travel by car convenient. The city's compact layout allows for easy movement once you arrive.



Hotels recommendations

For your stay during the LCAMP Conference and Student Hub 2026, here are some recommended hotels in Vitoria-Gasteiz. All are easily accessible from the city centre and the **Palacio de Congresos Europa**.

Recommended Hotels:

- El Caserón ★★★★ – historic charm with contemporary comforts
- Hotel Jardines de Uleta Suites ★★★★ – spacious suites, ideal for families or longer stays
- NH Canciller Ayala ★★★★ – central hotel with excellent conference facilities
- Sercotel Boulevard ★★★★ – modern design, close to shops and restaurants
- Silken Ciudad de Vitoria ★★★★ – contemporary comfort in the city centre
- AC General Álava by Marriott ★★★ – modern and comfortable, near transport links
- Holiday Inn Express ★★★ – convenient for business travel and short stays
- Hotel Gobeo Park ★★★ – quiet location with easy access to the city
- Hotel Palacio de Elorriaga ★★★ – unique historic palace setting with modern rooms
- Parador de Argómaniz ★★★★ – historic country house with high-end services, slightly outside the city centre

Additional Options:

Many more hotels and guesthouses are available throughout Vitoria-Gasteiz. Participants can find further options and book online via platforms such as Booking.com, Hotels.com, or the official Vitoria-Gasteiz tourism website.

Tip: Book early to secure your preferred accommodation, especially for nights around the conference dates. Some hotels may also offer special conference rates if booked in advance.



Main Sightseeing Highlights

- Historic Centre: Cathedral, Virgen Blanca, Plaza de España
- Arts & Museums: Museo de Bellas Artes, Artium
- Green Spaces: Green Belt, Jardín de la Florida, Parks
- Events & Conferences: Europa Conference Centre

Tips for Visitors

- Vitoria-Gasteiz is very walkable; most attractions in the centre are a short stroll apart.
- The Green Belt offers bike rentals and scenic routes — great for outdoor breaks between museums.
- Many museums have free or reduced entry days — check online before visiting.

Suggested Walking Routes

- **Classic Old Town Stroll (30–60 min):** Start at Plaza de la Virgen Blanca → Plaza de España → Cathedral of Santa María → Museo de Bellas Artes → Calle Herrería.
- **Culture Loop (2–3 hrs):** Cathedral → Museo de Bellas Artes → Artium Museum → Archaeology Museum (with café/rest stops in between).
- **Nature & City Mix (2–4 hrs):** Old Town → Jardín de la Florida → Green Belt (Anillo Verde) trails → Parque de la Senda.
